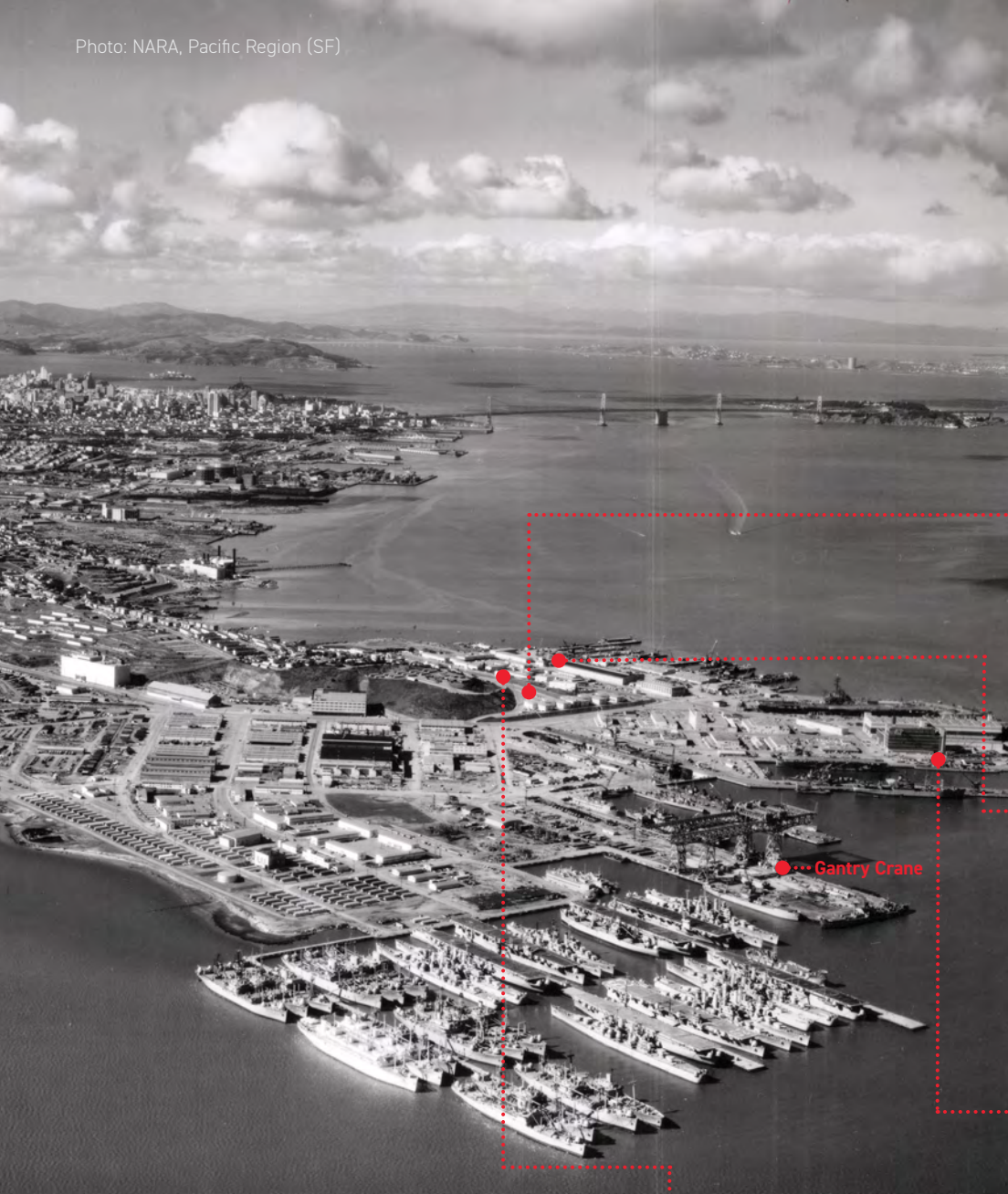


Warships, Art, Iconic Landmarks

Once a bustling Navy base, Hunters Point closed in 1974 after decades of military use. In 1984, artists began converting its industrial spaces into studios, forming the country's

largest artist community. Since the 1990s, an extensive environmental cleanup has been addressing its complex legacy of contamination. Today, as the site evolves, plans envision a new

San Francisco district that honors its history while embracing creativity and renewal. ShipyardStories.org will chronicle community stories, the site's history, and ongoing restoration efforts.



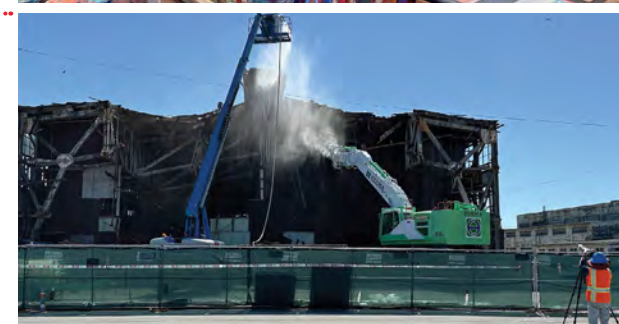

Parcel C Historic District

This area includes key structures, like Building 253, the Ordnance and Optical Shop, which features non-glare glass walls and was named the best industrial building of 1948. These buildings should be preserved to honor the Shipyard's history.

SHIPYARD CLEANUP



During wartime, the rush to prepare ships caused rapid handling of industrial materials, leading to lasting environmental damage. Remediation efforts began in the 1990s.

Shipyard Trust for the Arts hired two local, independent scientists to help the community understand the chemical and radiological contamination.

Parcel B Historic Arts District

The Navy is retesting soil on Parcel B due to past contractor misconduct, digging trenches near this home to 100 artists. We are working with them to ensure minimal impact and a safe cleanup.

Welder, Rigger, Pipefitter

Artists are engaging with Bayview Hunters Point residents through workshops, interviews, and events exploring their shared history of the Shipyard. Here are some of the outcomes of these collaborations.



Gantry Crane Illumination
Artists Ian Winters and Elaine Buckholtz transformed local seniors' words into a soundtrack and projections on the historic Gantry Crane. We will continue this project, reflecting on local history, culminating in another crane illumination in 2026.

Art meets History this Summer in Stacey Carter's Exhibition: *Decommissioned*
Curated by artist and historian Stacey Carter, *Decommissioned* explores the Hunters Point Shipyard's role in U.S. military history from World War I to the Cold War, its social impact and environmental fallout. The Shipyard was a key naval repair and research center, including radiation studies tied to nuclear weapons. Through oral histories, tours, and talks, visitors will engage with its industrial legacy and environmental challenges since the Navy ceased operations in 1974.

- Free Parking

The main parking lot is reached via Donahue Street. Limited parking is available at Building 101 and along Galvez Avenue.
- Walking

Walking is the easiest way to travel between all buildings, except ICS.
- Accessibility

All artist buildings are accessible on the first floor, but not the second. See the adjacent map for accessible entrances (101 in front, 104 in back). You should drive between buildings and use the plentiful, designated, reserved parking at each building.
- Restrooms

Building 101 has restrooms throughout the building. The other buildings only have one shared modular restroom near the food area.
- Navy Info Booth

Find Navy Info Booth in Building 101 in entrance area just East of Gallery. A radiological health expert will answer your safety questions.
- Viewing Points

Spectacular views of the shipyard can be enjoyed by stepping outside upstairs doors at end of side hallways in Building 101.
- Islais Creek Studios

These studios are part of our community, and a 5-minute drive from the Shipyard. When leaving, follow the red A-frame signs. See pages [28-29](#).

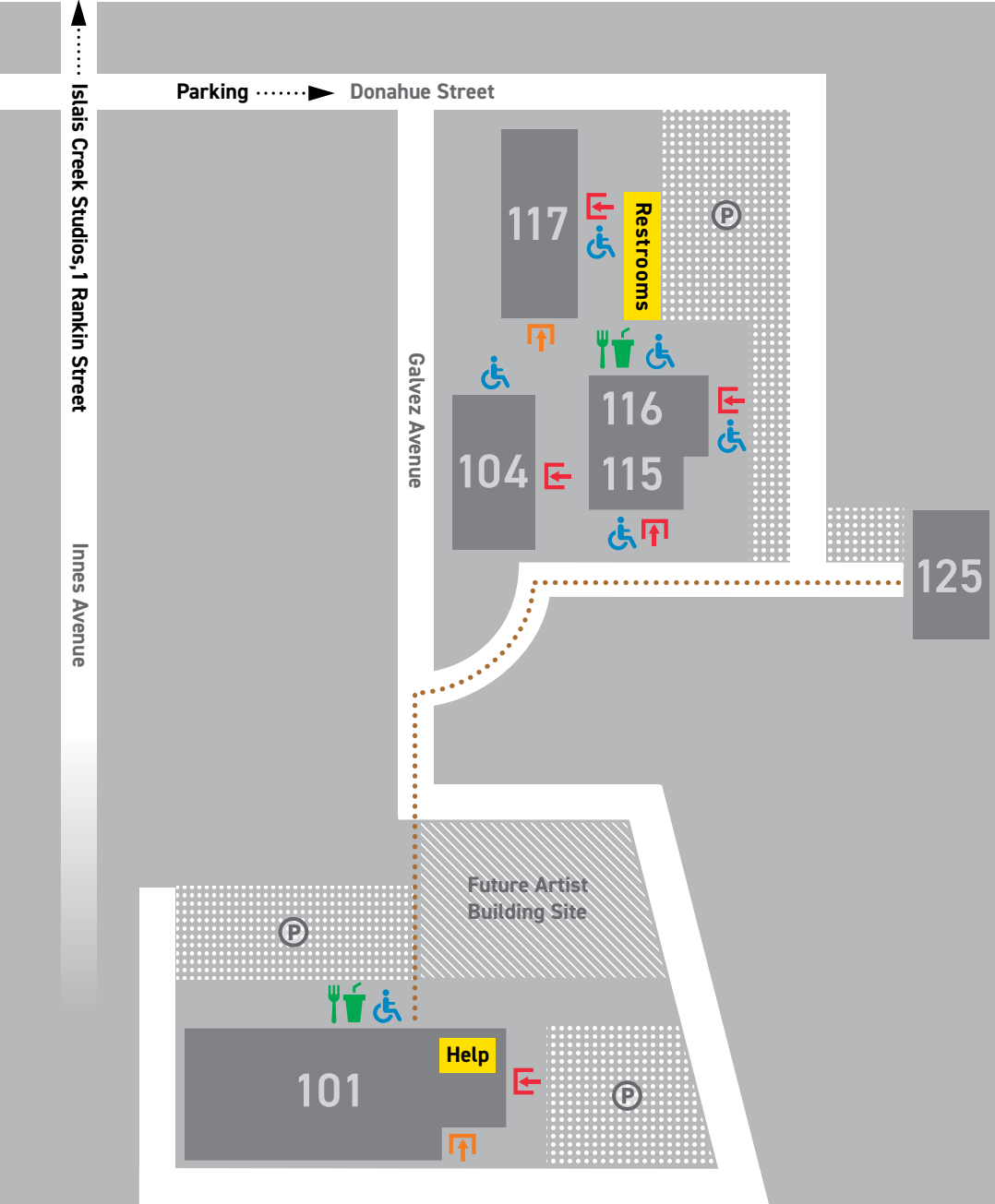
